### Sample Itinerary

**Lunch and Tour at Buffalo Run Farm Grill & Gifts.** Buffalo Run is located on property where Abraham Lincoln's cousin, Dennis Hanks once lived. If you've never had the chance to actually see live buffalo, Buffalo Run offers this rare opportunity to you. Buffalo Run offers a Legendary Lincoln cabin, a blab schoolhouse and a Native American teepee. 812-937-2799.

**Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial.** This National Park is the site where Abraham Lincoln grew up. Learn about the lives of Abraham Lincoln and his family, who lived here in a pioneer community from 1816 to 1830. Visitor Center: The Memorial Visitor Center features two Memorial Halls, a museum with a variety of exhibits and a 15-minute orientation film. Walking Tour: Take a walk up the wooded Lincoln Boyhood Trail to the gravesite of Abraham Lincoln's mother, Nancy Hanks Lincoln, and to the Cabin Site Memorial. Living Historical Farm: The Farm is a working pioneer homestead with a cabin, outbuildings, split rail fences, animals, gardens, and field crops. Rangers in period clothing perform a variety of activities typical of the 1820s. 812-937-4541.

**Colonel Jones Home.** The Jones Home is a restored 1834 Federal-design home of the merchant employer of Abraham Lincoln offers a unique look at the early development of Indiana and the life of Colonel William Jones, who was also a politician. The home includes guided tours, themed talks, exhibits and gifts. 812-937-4710.

**Dinner and "LINCOLN" at Lincoln Amphitheatre.** Located among the thick woods near Abraham Lincoln's boyhood home, Lincoln Amphitheatre is a beautiful, 1,500-seat covered amphitheatre. The scenic surroundings of the amphitheatre add to the magic of the Lincoln experience. 2009 marks the world premiere of our new play, "LINCOLN." This production will be a new theatrical experience, unlike any other. Guests will truly understand this humble man who many consider to be our greatest president. During the pre-show we offer guided walking tours, the Lincoln archives, artisans demonstrating pioneer tasks and other fascinating Lincoln experiences. 812-937-4493.
